



WELCOME TO OUR SUMMER NEWSLETTER!

Summer will be extra sweet this year, as it was slow in coming. The copious amounts of rain that we've recently received were much needed and much appreciated by trees, plants and people alike. All that warm rain resulted in lush green foliage and beautiful blooms for plants and trees alike. You may find that you have additional pruning needs this summer and fall following springs vigorous new growth. WATERING, MULCHING AND PRUNING

Throughout the warm days of summer, it is essential to ensure that your trees are receiving enough water. This is especially critical with young trees, which require more hydration support than mature, well-established trees. When the temps exceed 90 degrees, even mature trees will benefit from extra watering. When trees are not properly watered, they experience stress. This stress can result in short-term effects such as wilting and browning, but stress can also make trees susceptible to pests and disease down the road. This is definitely a case where an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. For more about how much water your tree actually needs, click here.

Mulching at the beginning of summer can help to protect your trees by keeping moisture in the soil, in turn keeping soil temperatures cooler. Mulch should be placed on the ground around the base of three, never piled up against the trunk. An added benefit of mulch is that it helps to reduce weeds.

You may also want to consider summer pruning. Summer can be a good time for a structural clean-up. Late summer is recommended for shrub and hedge pruning. For fruit trees in particular, pruning in the summer will promote more blossoms next spring, resulting in more fruit next summer!

Preventative care of your trees, before problems arise, is always recommended. Proper watering, mulching and pruning as needed are all essential steps towards supporting and maintaining the health of your trees.

Tree in the Spotlight



RED HORSE CHESTNUT (Aesculus x carnea)

The **Red Horse chestnut** is an excellent shade tree that will fit in most landscapes. Its showy cone-shaped flowers bloom in May among dark green leaves, making it a stand-out plant for early color. The flowers are extremely attractive to butterflies and hummingbirds.

Pros

- Easily available
- Medium-sized tree (Okay to plant in most yards)
- Grows quickly
- Showy flowers that are good for pollinators
- Leaves decompose quickly and produce excellent compost

Cons

- Very dense shade, restricting other planting options
- Nut litter sometimes heavy and a nuisance close to sidewalks or streets
- Nut are not edible like the regular chestnut
- Wood is not good at compartmentalizing decay (large wounds will easily lead to cavity)

TREE PLANTING

Caring for established trees is what we are best known for. You may not know that the arborists at Sperry are also passionate about selecting and planting trees also.

It starts with choosing the right tree for the right location. Taking into consideration the property owners' goal for the tree, the soil type, proximity to structures, nearby trees and plants, overhead lines and more helps the arborist to recommend trees that are best suited for the space. warm months will give them the opportunity to see your yard at its best and determine how new trees can be incorporated. Getting your tree order in early ensures that the specific variety that you want will be available for planting season.
